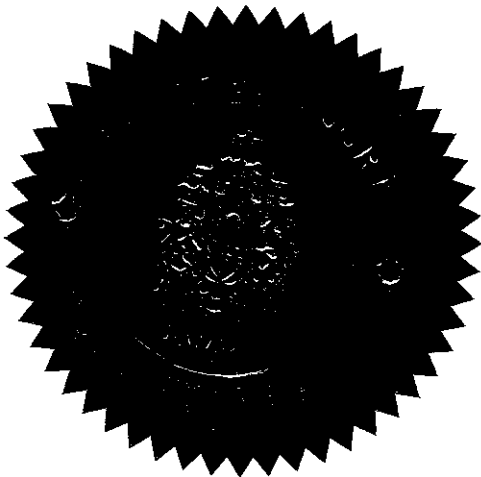

STATEMENT OF CLAIM

TO THE DEFENDANTS

A LEGAL PROCEEDING HAS BEEN COMMENCED AGAINST YOU by the Plaintiff. The claim made against you is set out in the following pages.

IF YOU WISH TO DEFEND THIS PROCEEDING, you or a solicitor acting for you are

required to prepare a statement of defence in Form 171B prescribed by the Federal Courts Rules serve it on the plaintiff's solicitor or, where the plaintiff does not have a solicitor, serve it on the plaintiff, and file it, with proof of service, at a local office of this Court, WITHIN 30 DAYS after this statement of claim is served on you, if you are served within Canada.

If you are served in the United States of America, the period for serving and filing your statement of defence is forty days. If you are served outside Canada and the United States of America, the period for serving and filing your statement of defence is sixty days.

Copies of the Federal Court Rules information concerning the local offices of the Court and other necessary information may be obtained on request to the Administrator of this Court at Montreal (telephone 514 283-6004) or at any local office.

IF YOU FAIL TO DEFEND THIS PROCEEDING, judgment may be given against you in your absence and without further notice to you.

CLAIM

1. The plaintiff claims against all defendants jointly and severally, the following in view of:
 - a. General damages in the amount of \$15,000,000 which is comprised of the following:

- i. Breach of duty (e.g. police officers gave false information to Swiss and other authorities)
 - ii. Breach of duty (e.g. made false statements against the Plaintiff); letter from Jacques Beaupre
 - b. Damages in the amount of 15,000,000 which is comprised of the following:
 - i. Abuse of power in the amount of \$5,000,000 and
 - ii. Abuse of process in the amount of \$10,000,000
 - c. General damages in the amount of \$10,000,000 for conspiracy as against the plaintiff (CRA, RMCP, Crown conspired together to maliciously prosecute plaintiff)
 - d. General damages in the amount of \$10,000,000 for pain, suffering, and psychological and psychiatric trauma;
 - e. A Declaration, pursuant to s. 52 (1) of the Constitution Act 1982 that some or all of the defendants have violated the Constitutional rights of the Plaintiff guaranteed by s. 6(1), 7, 11 (d), 12, and 15 (1) of the Constitution Act, 1982.
 - f. A Declaration pursuant to section 24 of the Charter of Rights and Freedoms that the Defendants have breached the rights of the plaintiff as guaranteed by section 24 of the Charter of Rights and Freedoms;
 - g. damages in the amount of \$5,000,000 for breach of constitutional rights as guaranteed by s. 15 (1) of the Constitution Act 1982;
 - h. damages in the amount of \$5,000,000 pursuant to section 24 of the Charter of Rights and Freedoms for breaches of the plaintiff's rights as guaranteed by section 24
 - i. punitive damages in the amount \$25,000,000.
 - j. Special damages in an amount to be ascertained (business losses) \$300,000,000
 - k. Its costs of this action on a solicitor and client basis.
2. That in view of the above, the Defendants herein have at various times in the recent past singularly or jointly and severally caused the damages claimed herein by their sole and exclusive fault(s) in effecting the following acts or omissions as listed hereafter:


- a. Defamation of character;
 - b. Breach of trust;
 - c. Breach of power;
 - d. Abuse of process;
 - e. Breach of Constitutional rights.
3. The whole as more particularly evidenced by the following circumstances namely:
- a. That the Canadian government through its agents, sought to destroy the reputation and business of the Plaintiff, giving false information to the Swiss authorities, by giving false statements to the Interpol agents in an effort for these agents to provide these false information to other jurisdictions: Lebanon, Switzerland, Dubai, Germany, France;
 - b. That the government was conspiring with its agents and departments to work together in this effort;
 - c. That the abuse of power and process was a cause and effect relationship. The abuse of power has denied the plaintiff due process and equal protection under the law;
 - d. That the severe conditions placed upon the plaintiff deny his rights of mobility and freedom to pursue his livelihood, further that these conditions represent cruel and unusual treatment; all based on false statements regarding Swiss matters;
 - e. That the plaintiff has pursued relief and assistance from various implicated departments of the Canadian government; and has received the “royal paper shuffle” from all levels of ministries;
 - f. That concurrent with the above, Canadian immigration has made an administrative decision to deport the plaintiff’s common-law wife, this has obviously put additional stress and fear into the lives of the family of the plaintiff, the plaintiff, his minor children (who are all Canadian) and his wife.

WHEREFORE WE ASK THIS HONORABLE COURT FOR:

- (a) An order that these defendants provide a full and detailed written accounting to plaintiff of all their activities, actions, and decisions made by their agents;

- (b) An injunction prohibiting these defendants from further harmful and malicious acts causing harm and damages against the plaintiff;
- (c) A declaration that these defendants are liable, as the principal and/or employer for the acts of their employees and/or agents;
- (d) Punitive and exemplary damages;
- (e) An order condemning the Defendants jointly and severally to compensate forthwith the Plaintiff party herein to the full extent of the specific claims enumerated above, together with expenses and disbursements for expertise, and all legal interests as may apply in the circumstances of this matter.
- (f) Pre and Post judgment interests;
- (g) The Plaintiff's costs;
- (h) Such further and other relief as this Honorable Court may seem just.
